When the stomach and spleen QI is weak, the tongue may show central cracks accompanied by a pale or swollen tongue body. This reflects impaired digestion and fluid metabolism, leading to dryness and fissures. Individuals with this pattern often experience fatigue, poor appetite, bloating, and loose stools.

EXCESS HEAT OR FIRE PATTERN

EXCESS HEAT IN THE BODY CAN CAUSE THE TONGUE TO CRACK DUE TO FLUID DEPLETION. THE TONGUE USUALLY APPEARS RED WITH A YELLOW COATING AND DEEP, IRREGULAR FISSURES. SYMPTOMS MAY INCLUDE A FEELING OF HEAT, THIRST, CONSTIPATION, AND IRRITABILITY. THIS PATTERN MAY ARISE FROM LIFESTYLE FACTORS SUCH AS STRESS, SPICY DIET, OR INFECTIONS.

ADDITIONAL THERAPIES

OTHER SUPPORTIVE THERAPIES INCLUDE TUINA MASSAGE, QIGONG EXERCISES, AND CUPPING, WHICH HELP ENHANCE THE BODY'S ENERGY FLOW AND OVERALL VITALITY.
