This later became a popular nursery rhyme used to calm all infants in the classroom. Another popular nursery rhyme for children around the age of four is One Two Three ABC Jesus Loves Me. The children would recite the poem with such excitement. At the end of the poem the children were eager to shout loudly JESUS LOVES ME OR WHERE WOULD I BE!

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
