The fixture's neutral wire connects directly to the neutral wire from the power source, while its hot wire connects to the common terminal wire from the second switch. Ensure all connections are secure and properly insulated.

Step 6: Secure and Test

Carefully place all wiring back into the electrical boxes, secure the switches, restore power, and test the switches to confirm proper operation from both locations.

Common Wiring Configurations

Various wiring configurations can be used depending on the existing wiring and fixture placement. Understanding these setups aids in adapting to different scenarios.

Power to Switch First

In this common configuration, the power source enters the first 3 way switch box. The traveler wires run between the two switches, and the switched hot wire extends from the second switch to the light fixture.
